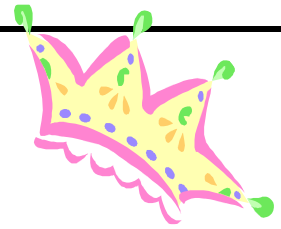




Ladies Spring Retreat

New Life Family Matters

“Then Samuel ...cried out to the LORD ON Israel's behalf, and the LORD ANSWERED him. While Samuel was sacrificing the burnt offering, the Philistines drew near to engage Israel in battle. But that day the LORD THUNDERED with loud thunder against the Philistines and threw them into such a panic that they were routed before the Israelites. Then Samuel took a stone and set it up...He named it Ebenezer, saying, “Thus far has the LORD HELPED us.” So the Philistines were subdued and did not invade Israelite territory again.” 1 Samuel 7:9-14

The above scripture reveals God’s redemptive activity on behalf of His people. It reveals His divine initiative on behalf of His people followed by a “faith-prompted” response from those He rescued. In this passage of scripture, we are reading about literal history –real people and real events. But scripture is also representative in that it is given to us to teach us about ourselves, about life, and about our God.

For the New Life Family, this portion of scripture was brought to our attention during the past Advent season as we learned about Emmanuel, God with us, and the joy that is promised to those who receive the gift of life through Christ. Using lessons from the story, *The Christmas Carol*, we learned that Ebenezer (stone of help) became known as “Scrooge” (bah, hum- bug) because of a stingy, self-centered, materialistic lifestyle. But we also learned that the story of Scrooge doesn’t end at this point, but rather, through “divine intervention”, he has an experience that transforms him into a benevolent, caring, and relational man –Ebenezer.

Three words express direction and mission for the New Life Family in 2010: community, caring, compassion.

Community. Jesus called us as individuals and baptized us into His body (1Cor 12:12,13). Life as a follower of Jesus is sustained and thrives in vital relationship with other believers. Loving and being loved makes the heart come alive. Loving one another is a humanly impossible task but, by His Spirit within us, we are empowered to do this and made alive by His living hands and heart (fellow believers). In 2010, we will place much emphasis upon essential relationships among Jesus’ followers through our Home Church Network.

Caring. This is simply our response to God’s love for us –to love one another (1John 4:11,12). A caring community grows large in its ability to embrace. No one is left behind. No one slips through the cracks of busyness. No one slowly drifts away from Christ because in a vital caring community someone is always asking, “How are you doing?” Our Home Church Network will provide the basis to be able to experience this love of God. Smaller, intentional meetings of Jesus’ Church –gathered together to honor and worship Him, and to love Him by loving each other.

Compassion. Like our care for one another within Jesus’ Body, compassion is moved by the hurts and joys of others, but compassion moves boldly beyond the walls of Jesus’ Church and reaches out to those who do not yet know the love of God through Jesus Christ. Our mission statement of being “Neighbors for life” (Luke 10:29-37) comes directly from Jesus’ teaching and question about who we are responsible to love. Neighbors love the folks in their circle of influence in practical ways. They get involved. They feel their pain. They get messy and are moved to do something. When we, like the good Samaritan, “see and respond” –Jesus has a way of empowering us beyond ourselves to meet needs that are beyond our natural selves.

Like Martin Luther King who had a dream empowered by the ideals of Jesus’ Kingdom (peace, hope & joy), I too have a dream of being part of a community of fellow believers who love God with our whole heart, soul, strength and mind, and our neighbors as ourselves. What a difference a community like this can make. I have a dream –join me in dreaming too.
